Esperanto defendas la lingvojn de Eŭropo

Jen resumo (de Trevor Steele) de prelego kaj dokumento pri praktikaj kaj teoriaj problemoj en agado de Neregistaraj Organizaĵoj (NRO-oj) cele al lingva egaleco en eŭropa perspektivo. David Ferguson/Dafydd ap Fergus. Li ĝin prezentis en Unesko-konferenco pri plurlingveco en Eŭropo. De oficejo en Bruselo, Dafydd, profesia ĵurnalisto, gvidas la Eŭropan Esperanto-Union (EEU), kiu estas kunlabora organizo de la landaj asocioj en la Eŭropa Unio (EU). EEU, de kiu EAB estas aliĝinta landa asocio, intime kunlaboras kun Universala Esperanto-Asocio, kiu subvencias ĝian funkciadon.

Tutmondaj ekonomiaj kaj sociaj evoluoj antaŭenigas uzadon de la angla lingvo en multaj konteksto, kie estas diskrimacio kontraŭ aliaj lingvoj. Unu ekzemplo estas la kreskanta tendenco dungi denaskajn parolantojn de la angla por postenoj teorie malfermitaj al civitanoj de ĉiuj EU-landoj. Alia estas la postulo, ke ŝtatoj-kandidatoj por membreco en EU uzu la anglan por komuniki kun EU-instancoj. Ankoraŭ alia estas, ke la angla estis adoptita kiel la komuna lingvo de armea brigado ĉeĥa-pola-slovaka.

Fortaj politikaj-komercaj interesgrupoj direktas tiun evoluon sen publika diskuto. Rezisto estas malfacila. En diversaj landoj ekzistas NRO-oj, kiuj provas protekti sian propran lingvon, kaj estas la Esperanto-movado, kiu celas uzon de neŭtrala lingvo internacia.

La malforteco de la lingvo-protektaj grupoj estas ilia mal-larĝa fokuso. Se grupo celas defendi nur unu, propran lingvon, ĝi malfacile povas paroli pri lingva egaleco ĝenerale, kaj ĝi

malfacile kunlaboras kun simila sed alilingva grupo kaj teorie kaj pro manko de komuna komunikilo.

La agadon de la Eŭropa Esperanto-Unio ĝis nun grandparte ignoris la oficialaj instancoj, sed lastatempe estas kelkaj indikoj pri kunlaboro inter la plej

fortaj lingvoprotektaj grupoj, nome la germana kaj la franca.

Elections at the AGM

According to the Constitution of EAB: 'The Annual General Meeting shall [...] elect the members of the Management Committee to serve until the end of the next Annual General Meeting'. However, it is not specified how this election is to be conducted.

One possibility is for the AGM to elect the Committee, which then amongst itself elects the officers: president, 'at least one and not more than three' vice-presidents, honorary secretary and honorary treasurer. Another possibility is for the AGM to elect the officers directly (but presumably only one vice-president in this manner).

Arguments for the first approach are that all committee members have the same legal responsibility as trustees and

might benefit from being able to divide roles appropriately when it is known who is on the committee. Arguments for the second approach are that members may wish to have more control over how the committee is constituted, and that otherwise the association is without officers until the committee has met for the first time.

The committee would be interested to hear members' opinions on how elections should be conducted, both at this year's AGM in Glasgow and in general, and whether the constitution should be amended to specify this more precisely. You can write either to me or to the editor of *Update*.

Upgrading or downgrading?

We give Eric Walker a great vote of thanks for valiantly taking on the editorship of *Update* and running it for so long. Now that he has decided to move on there will be no earth-moving policy change for the contents of *Update*. However, I trust it will evolve with your help. I am searching for more regular or occasional contributions in all fields, so let's have yours!

EAB's three periodicals

EAB's periodicals – *Update*, *La Brita Esperantisto* and *EAB NetNews* (yes, amazingly we have three while other national associations struggle with one) – are fundamental to the health of Esperanto in Britain.

Window also from outside?
The periodicals should constitute not only our window into the Esperanto movement but also function as a window into the movement from outside – ideally of sufficient quality to form part of the information thrust into the hands of interested parties, especially those in national languages. Nevertheless, this doesn't mean *Update* should be wholly in English, for we speak and use

Esperanto in our daily international lives as a commitment to cultural and linguistic human rights.

While other organisations talk of human rights and then consciously or unconsciously accept a discriminatory order, we practise them and protest that this order is wrong and unnecessary. We don't just profess Esperanto, we use it.

But *Update* is also for those who are beginning their international journey discovering Esperanto's values.

One superior periodical?

Should we not be thinking of amalgamating *Update* with *La Brita Esperantisto*? Does that not have many advantages, not least in cost, quality and time saved to do so many other necessary things? What's your opinion?

Perception v. reality

Before the election of EAB's partially new Management Committee, rumours were circulating both about the function of the previous committee and the intentions of the 'new' members. My own reason for standing as a candidate was that I wasn't

happy with the perception of EAB but I kept fairly silent as I knew I didn't know enough about the real workings of the committee to voice an opinion in public.

My own general view now – for what you may think it's worth – is that the committee had been doing a good job. What was wrong was perception. A titanic amount of work had to be put into planning and building the new Esperanto House in Barlaston and moving everything in from storage. Inevitably, as a smallish voluntary organisation, this has taken its toll on other activities, not least information both to the international Esperanto movement and to the media and general public.

EAB's Management Committee is working harmoniously, but any voluntary organisation works only as well as the quantity and quality of its volunteers – and each of us has something to give.

Points from the last meeting

EAB's Management Committee met again on 8 February 2003 at the Quaker International Centre in London. Present were David Bisset, Graham Blakey, Joyce Bunting, Helen Fantom, Edmund Grimley Evans, Grahame Leon-Smith, Geoffrey Sutton and the Director of Development David Kelso.

Eric Walker's resignation

The committee had already been informed of Eric Walker's decision to resign as both trustee and editor of *Update*.

Eric's work over several years in keeping a newsletter going when no one else could be found to take on the task is much appreciated by all.

Update

Eric's sudden resignation as editor of *Update* meant that urgent action needed to be taken to ensure continued publication, especially coming up to the Annual General Meeting.

It was decided that Geoffrey Sutton will take over the production as editor, and all publication issues will be reviewed at the Barlaston weekend meeting of the Management Committee in June.

It was also agreed that, as notification for the AGM has to be sent out with details of the accounts, the publication date of this issue of *Update* had to be brought forward by approximately two weeks.

Handbook

The committee decided that the association does require a handbook for members. Unfortunately, there had not been a good response to the circular requesting information for the book. The contents and format will require much thought.

Finance

Joyce Bunting, the Honorary Treasurer, presented the Statement of Financial Activities for the year ended 31 October 2002, together with a balance sheet for the period, containing the independent

examiner's statement. This was approved and signed. (See insert.)

Publicity

It was agreed to make all published leaflets available on the EAB website in due course. The prime importance of publicity is keenly felt by the trustees, and steps are being taken to increase the time devoted to it.

A proposal is being worked out for a probable part-time post dealing with publicity, but in recognition of the importance of this area of activity, the trustees have already empowered the Director of Development to start work before a formal proposal is made and approved.

Education

Grahame Leon-Smith is to explore what possibility there might be to include Esperanto in the new Learn Direct programme, and he intends to talk to the BBC on the possibility of translating more of their educational material.

ing the procedure at the AGM in 2004. It is not procedurally possible to do this earlier, but the process needs to be started now.

Human rights and the Charity Commission

A working party is still attempting to draft a proposal for a new constitution for EAB.

The Charity Commission has recently announced that human rights are now considered an acceptable goal for a charity. The working party will be taking this into consideration to make this fundamental part of our *raison d'être* explicit in the constitution.

Textbook in Telugu?

The committee also approved permission for the Esperanto Society in Tirupati, in the Indian state of Andra Pradesh, to translate and publish *The Esperanto Teacher* by Mason Stuttard in Telugu. The secretary is following up this important initiative in the hope that it can be brought to fruition in the not too distant future. □

Report of the Trustees for 2002

The Trustees present their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2002 (see insert).

Objects of the association

The aims of the charity are to advance the education of the public in the international language Esperanto.

Status: The Charity is an unincorporated organisation governed by its constitution. It was registered as Charity no. 272676 in 1976.

Organisation

The trustees are the members of the Management Committee of the Esperanto-Asocio de Britio, elected by the Annual General Meeting to serve until the end of the next AGM. The names of the trustees who served during the year are: Edmund Grimley Evans (President), Geoffrey Sutton (Hon. Secretary – elected May 2002), David Bisset (Vice President), Joyce Bunting (Hon. Treasurer), Eric Walker (Editor of *Update*), Helen Fantom (Vice president, elected May 2002), Frank Spilsbury, Graham Blakey (elected May 2002), Grahame Leon-Smith (elected May 2002), and serving until May 2002: Bill Walker (Minutes Secretary), Grazyna Mitchener, Paul Hewitt and Fennel Walters.

The Director of Development was appointed by the trustees. Subcommittees and individuals are appointed by the Management Committee to carry out specific tasks, requiring feedback to the Committee.

Investment powers

Under the Constitution, the charity has power to make

investments as the trustees see fit.

Related parties

The charity has relations with other Esperanto organisations both in Britain and abroad.

Review of activities and achievements

• New Headquarters

The greatest effort this year has been the refurbishment of the old coachhouse at Wedgwood Memorial College, Barlaston, for use as the association's office, Esperanto-Domo, with an extension for the Butler Library behind, and three bedrooms above.

Construction work was completed just in time to allow participants at the British Esperanto Congress in Stoke-on-Trent to visit in May. Following that, the Butler Library was moved from storage in Ipswich to the new premises. This involved a lot of work. Art works which had been renovated were brought back from safe keeping with Geoff Wood. The new office was furnished, and books and equipment transferred from temporary accommodation in Wedgwood College library. The Association is grateful to the college for this allocation of working space and extra storage and for help given in many ways to ease the move.

The official opening of the new headquarters took place on 17 September, when Renato Corsetti, president of the Universal Esperanto Association, and Councillor Ellis Bevan, Lord Mayor of the City of Stoke-on-Trent, performed the opening ceremonies. Dr Komorowski, the Polish Ambassador, gave a short speech and other civic dignitaries congratulated EAB on their

choice of location, welcoming the association to the city.

National and local press, television and radio coverage of the inauguration, including interviews with Renato Corsetti, David Kelso and Derek Tatton, resulted in many enquiries. Our two lady members of staff appeared in a follow-up article in the local press where they spoke about their own experiences of learning Esperanto. The event was also widely reported in the Esperanto press and news websites.

Surrounding the building, an 'Esperanto Garden' has been developed, incorporating existing mature trees and the existing 'Esperanto Sculpture'. People wishing to support the garden may do so by contacting Derek Tatton, Principal of Wedgwood College, or the EAB office.

Education

• Courses at Barlaston

These included the prestigious 'Somera Lernejo' in August, 'Ni Festivalu' in January, 'Esperanto Day' in March, which included sessions for beginners, SATEB (British section of SAT) weekend in May and a three-day cultural event surrounding the official opening of the HQ in September.

• New Esperanto course

A new course *Elementary...!* based on the book *Gerda Malaperis* by Claude Piron, was commissioned by EAB and developed by the Education Committee. The first two parts were launched and available for inspection at the HQ during the inauguration. The final part of the 25-lesson course will be ready at the end of December 2002. Our office administrator, Viv O'Dunne, is currently studying this course.

Angela Tellier and Malcolm Jones were assisted by Bill Walker and Terry Page on this enterprise.

- *'Esperanto Education'* (formerly Esperanto Teachers Association), a registered charity, transferred all its assets to EAB in August 2002. This included its stocks of teaching materials, cash and National Savings Bonds. The monetary assets appear in the financial statement as 'Education Fund'.

- *The Butler Library*
This is a major educational resource, and it is hoped to register it nationally as a 'Residential Library' in conjunction with Wedgwood Memorial College, where students may stay to study. The college administers the bedroom lettings, along with its own rooms.

- *Bendoteko*
This is a lending collection of sound cassettes in Esperanto on educational and cultural topics, administered by Eric Walker. A catalogue is available from the office.

Publicity

The focus has been on the Official Opening event. This was choreographed by professionals Jim and Gaynor Voiles,

assisted by the publicity committee, Wedgwood College and the EAB office staff. New information packs for enquirers were produced to coincide with the inauguration. Advertisements were placed in selected publications and the results monitored.

- *World Federalist Movement*
In June, Esperantists were invited to participate in a discussion about the International Language at a meeting of the WFM in London. As a result, a motion was passed in favour of adopting Esperanto as a fair and neutral means of communicating internationally.

- *New web and e-mail domain names and service providers* were adopted. The web site www.esperanto-gb.org was updated by David Bisset with reports and future events.

- *EAB NetNews*
This English-language e-mail newsletter, which is produced as a PR tool as well as for our own members, continued to appear monthly under the editorship of Ian Fantom. The emphasis has been in connecting Esperanto with world events such as educational initiatives, parliamentary debates, EU discussions, the arts, etc. To receive *EAB NetNews* send an e-mail to:

Publications

- *La Brita Esperantisto (LBE)* was revived and two editions published during the year, which were well received. This all-Esperanto journal is sent to full members. Additional copies may be purchased from the EAB Office. Thanks are extended to the editor, Paul Gubbins, and compiler, Simon Bennett-Davies.

During the period when *LBE* did not appear, members received *La Ondo de Esperanto* instead, an all-Esperanto international journal, as a stopgap. This ceased after December 2002.

- *EAB Update*, the newsletter for members and supporters, was sent four times, plus two supplements with *LBE*. Thanks to Eric Walker.

Congress

The British Esperanto Congress was held in Stoke-on-Trent in May. Terry Page took on the organisation of this event efficiently at short notice. The office staff helped with administration.

Membership

Membership-based organisations do not seem to attract support in today's society, though interest has been stimulated as a result of publicity and media involvement. The advanced age of the membership has resulted in high losses this year. At the end of October 2002, 471 full members (with voting rights) and 91 supporters were enrolled. Subscription rates will remain unchanged at £25 full membership (£20 concessionary rate) and £10 for Supporters.

Esperanto Action ceased

latterly. Those of its members who are not members of EAB will be invited to join, and will receive *EAB Update*.

• *Federations*

The national network (and the Scottish Association) continues as in recent years: some active, some dormant. The federations now play an additional role as the natural point of contact for the many Esperantists who enter the movement through the internet and thus have no connection with a local group.

Staff and volunteers

Once the new office was ready, our administrative staff hours were increased, so that Viv works four flexible days a week, and Lydia Arnold three hours. They deal with all membership renewals and queries, mail-order book services at home and overseas, control book stocks and day-to-day finances. In addition, they help enquirers and send information packs, allocate tutors for the Free Postal Course and keep databases up to date. They co-ordinate queries from the press and media with suitable Esperanto representatives.

David Kelso, Director of Development, changed his arrangements, and is working on a consultancy basis, averaging one day per week.

The hard work of all the staff was a major factor in the successful move. They co-operated in the organisation and publicity surrounding the inauguration of the new HQ. It was nice to see them at the Congress in Stoke.

Wedgwood Memorial College staff were most co-operative, which helped operations to run smoothly in this busy year of change.

The trustees are also indebted to many devoted volunteers who have worked for the

association during the year: administrators, editors, tutors, examiners, teachers (especially those who produced the new Elementary course), the organisers of the British congress, librarians, etc.

Bequests and donations

The Association benefited from generous legacies left by Edmund Ashcroft, Bernard Smith and Phyllis Strapps. Donations included gifts to the Education Fund and the Esperanto Garden. Donations may be designated for these purposes or for the Butler Library, Publicity or *Afrika Agado*.

Scout League

A sum of money has been entrusted to EAB from the Scouts Esperanto League of Britain. The Scout movement may use it to re-form the league within seven years, after which it may be used in other ways for young people.

Future strategy

The newly elected body of trustees discussed their roles and responsibilities during an intensive weekend workshop in June. Some items from their programme included:

- Complete the third part of the Elementary course by the end of 2002.
- Produce leaflets to help students to chose the right course. Review courses, publicise.
- Strengthen IT and computer methods of learning Esperanto.
- Catalogue the Butler Library fully.
- Sort collections bequeathed to EAB.
- Place advertisements in suitable publications.
- Involve and link volunteer workers.
- Computerise accounting.
- Revise the EAB Handbook.

Risk management

Risk applies not only to money, but all activities of the associa-

tion, and the trustees have endeavoured to address this by putting appropriate systems in place. Investments are spread between four companies, in different types of units.

Reserves

The association has free reserves of £1,238,701. Of these £184,442 is represented by fixed assets including the new building. The balance is held to generate income for the foreseeable future. This is considered necessary in view of the ageing membership.

Investment policy

The trustees, over time, have invested capital in specialised unit trusts, designed for the charity sector, to meet the need for both income and growth. Independent financial advisors (IFA) were consulted in August 2002, one of whom said he would charge £1,000 to manage the investment portfolio, at the same time admitting that EAB's assets were already reasonably well spread. Another IFA said EAB would be better off without him, and should stay with the recognised Charity Investment Companies.

The current financial climate is not healthy, so the trustees have left a substantial amount on deposit. However, a further £20,000 was invested in the 'Charities Property Fund' on 30 September. This is one of the few areas that is performing reasonably well at present. Advice is that 8–10% of capital is a reasonable proportion to invest in property funds. EAB's policy is to provide income and growth for many years, at the same time permitting the release of capital for well-considered projects in furtherance of the aims of the charity.

Inspiring bedtime reading?

The new format of *EAB Update* will include regular information from HQ. As you know Eric Walker has resigned, so I'd like first to say a big thank you to him for all his help and guidance with EAB administration procedure.

When I started working with EAB, back in April 2001, I imagined that it was a fairly simple business, to do with membership records, renewal of subscriptions and occasional mailings. Since then, the work has just grown to include

financial records, database management, the website, producing publicity material, the EAB book service and so on. Now, there just doesn't seem enough time in the four days I work to do everything, and there is no danger of Lydia (who is on a flexible contract to deal with peaks of work) and me ever being bored!

Some achievements so far at Barlaston include:

- ★ Computerisation of our accounting system.
- ★ An update of our enquirer

packs (new stationery, leaflets, an excellent presentation folder and glossy Free Postal Course first lesson) – not yet complete but progressing.

★ **Increased publicity** from the office (albeit just in Staffordshire, but it's a start).

Following the opening of Esperanto House, we had a short slot on the TV evening news bulletin *Central News* along with various radio interviews. There were three positive articles in the *Evening Sentinel*, North Staffordshire's evening newspaper, and two features in *Staffordshire Life* (Oct. & Feb. issues. Copies for are available from the office; please send SAE).

★ **The new IT system** is able to provide detailed reports to the Management Committee of book sales, recruits to the Free Postal Course, and enquirers, indicating the source of information, etc.

★ **The Butler Library** is used on a regular basis for seminars and group meetings; our enquirer packs are taken away by college visitors from all over the globe. The Butler Library is now used as a seminar room by many groups, from local language students to health authority executives.

The three bedrooms are regularly replenished with an EAB enquirer pack: a biography of Zamenhof by Marjorie Boulton and a copy of *Teach Yourself Esperanto*. Inspiring bedtime reading?

★ **The office's co-ordinating role** includes working closely with dedicated Esperantists (ManCom members and the unsung EAB members who work tirelessly within the association).

★ **The number of enquirers** who contact the office on the phone is increasing (see page 3 on the new phone number 0845 230 1887).

★ **Federations/Groups:** The contact database at HQ is also growing. Any new member or supporter of EAB is given details of their local group, federation and/or details of an EAB contact nearby. As a 'komencanto', I realise that communicating with others is the whole point of learning Esperanto. New learners can often lose interest if they have no one to practise with. If you're willing to chat with learners in your area, please let me know. EAB must adhere to the Data Protection Act by not disclosing information without a member's consent, but it's still possible to make contact with others; EAB can act as mediator (send SAE).

The list of other lecturers is formidable: Dr Siân Leitch, Ed Robertson and Hju Rid on linguistic themes; Duncan Thomson on computer communication; Charlie Dornan on the etymology of Scottish place-names; and Jack Casey on that Scot who changed the world: John Logie Baird. Dr Paul Gubbins will conduct a 'master class' on contributing to *La Brita Esperantisto*. Beginners will receive an Esperanto initiation. There will be at least two forums, and an

education session is also planned. JEB is coming back to life; they will 'present themselves'. From-time-to-time alternative sessions will occur for the younger generation. If kids arrive, there will be sessions for them based on the slogan 'Esperanto is fun!'.

On the wider cultural front, Stephen Thomson will make us all sing, and will also declaim from Dostoevsky. There will be young musicians, including Connal McKay and Mike Seaton. A highlight of the weekend will be a one-hour comedy about Dr Z, written by Paul Gubbins and directed by Colin Simmonds.

The banquet will take place within a rich cultural context and a light-hearted celebration of the centenaries of the Glasgow and Edinburgh Esperanto societies. David Kelso will speak after dinner about a perennial Scottish theme: the relationship between Glasgow and Edinburgh.

The lunch on the last day will take place in a renowned Russian restaurant and will be proceeded by a visit to an astonishing collection of Russian kinetic sculptures.

Excursions

Come on a local excursion to the new Science Centre beside the Clyde or the Tall Ship on the Clyde or the Botanic Gardens in the West End. There will also be a walking tour of the Central Glasgow Outstanding Conservation Area led.

When you book you will receive a list of hotels. Remember that city centre parking is expensive.

Why not stay for a week? Glasgow is a wonderful base for seeing other parts of Scotland.

Responsibilities of the trustees in relation to the financial statements

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements at the end of each financial year which give a true and fair view of its financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year. In doing so the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed subject to any departures

disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and

- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention of fraud and other irregularities.
